

But there is also frustration among vice chancellors that much of the work they are doing remains, by necessity, unpublicized. Progress has been made on individual campuses in terms of confronting potential extremism on a case-by-case basis. There have been occasions, the spokesman said, when universities have confronted extremism-related incidents of lawbreaking or incitement to religious or racial hatred, but such efforts do not receive any attention.

At University College London, the alma mater of the accused Christmas Day attacker, for example, the institution has had to deal with speakers known for espousing extremism, said Mr. Worton, the vice provost. During freshman week, for example, when student organizations are recruiting members, "we are aware that there have been attempts by extremist imams or Muslims to come into campus," he said. The university has handled that situation by consulting with members of the student Islamic society, who asked to be allowed to convey to the speakers the message that they were not welcome on campus.

"Our view has always been that universities must be places for debate," Mr. Worton said. "We believe completely in freedom of speech, within the law." That last provision, he emphasized, "is not just a rider, it is a nonnegotiable," and it underpins all of the university's efforts. At the same time, University College London and other institutions "don't want to be in position where we are assuming the role of any kind of covert security service," he said.

The university has also become more vigilant in terms of noticing potentially troubling shifts in a student's behavior. "If, for instance, a young man were to change the way he were dressing, and to start dressing more radically, wearing a beard, and taking on traditional garb, we would want to know why it happened," Mr. Worton said. The university would deal with such a situation through the student's tutor, seeking to learn the roots of the change in behavior, but not necessarily to censor it. "We just need to know if things are untoward."

A Student's Puzzling Transformation

In Mr. Abdulmutallab's case, the university has set up an independent panel to examine his time there. Mr. Abdulmutallab's tutor, the faculty member who knew him best, "had no indication that there was any untoward behavior," Mr. Worton said. "We are all enormously surprised and have uncovered no indication that he was radicalized on campus, or indeed off it, during his time here."

Mr. Rafiq, who also attended University College London and was Mr. Abdulmutallab's predecessor as president of the Islamic society, seemed to share that view. "There was never any indication whatsoever that he was harboring any extremist views," Mr. Rafiq told *The Chronicle*, which is why the Nigerian's arrest "comes as such a huge shock," he said. He described Mr. Abdulmutallab, whom he said he knew well, as "well-mannered, well-spoken, kind, caring, and humble," and said that, although the Nigerian's religious devotion was evident, he never expressed any political views and never appeared to be angry or upset.

"He was an international student coming to the UK," Mr. Rafiq recalled. "We just assumed him to be politically naïve."

Other details of Mr. Abdulmutallab's biography that have emerged indicate that his time in London and at University College London was not necessarily a decisive turning point in his embrace of radical Islam. The son of a wealthy Nigerian banker, he enjoyed a privileged upbringing and attended a boarding school in Togo popular with members of the West African elite. According to reports in Nigerian papers, while at secondary school, Mr. Abdulmutallab was apparently already known for his growing devotion to Islam, earning the nickname "Alfa," a local term for a religious scholar, for his propensity for preaching to his fellow students. He spent time in Internet chat rooms and, according to one discussion thread, he traveled to Yemen in June 2005, before his arrival in London, for a three-month Arabic course. Authorities are now linking him to a Yemen-based group affiliated with Al Qaeda.

Despite the new concerns for universities raised by Mr. Abdulmutallab's case, the consensus that has emerged over the past few years—that while there may be pockets of extremism in some institutions, the problem is not widespread throughout higher education—has not been called into serious question.

The home secretary, the government minister responsible for domestic security, spoke in Parliament on Tuesday of the need for universities to remain as open environments.

"It is important to remember that the values of openness, intellectual scrutiny, and the freedom of debate and tolerance promoted in higher education are one of the most effective ways of challenging views which we may find abhorrent but that remain within the law," the secretary, Alan Johnson, said. "However, we know that a small minority of people supporting violent extremism have actively sought to influence and recruit people through targeting learners in colleges and universities, and we must offer universities the best advice and guidance to help prevent extremism."

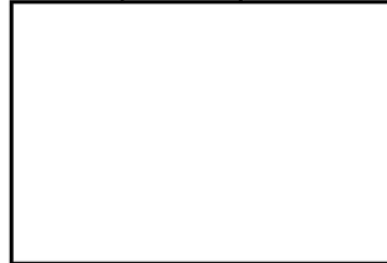

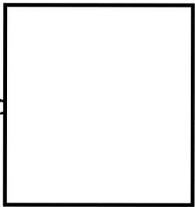
